WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE INTERNET?



The first **prototype** of the Internet comes in the late 1960s with the creation of ARPANET, or the Advanced **Research** Projects Agency Network. Originally funded by the U.S. Department of Defense, ARPANET allow multiple computers to communicate on a single network.

On October 29, 1969, ARPAnet delivers its first message from one computer to another - The first computer located in a research lab at UCLA and the second at Stanford; each one the size of a small house. The message—“LOGIN”— is short and simple, but it **crashes** the ARPA network anyway.

The World Wide Web (WWW), or the Web, is an information system where documents and other web resources are accessible over the Internet. The World Wide Web is not synonymous with the Internet, which pre-existed the Web.

English scientist Tim Berners-Lee invented the World Wide Web in 1989. He writes the first web browser in 1990, in Switzerland. The browser is released to the general public in August 1991. The Web begins to enter everyday use in 1993-4, when websites for general use start to become **available**. The World Wide Web is the primary **tool** billions of people use to interact on the Internet.

Web resources may be any type of downloaded media, but web pages are hypertext documents formatted in Hypertext Markup Language (HTML). In addition to text, web pages may contain references to images, video, audio, or streams of multimedia content.

Website content can be **provided** by a publisher, or a user. Websites are provided for a **myriad** of informative, **entertainment**, commercial, and governmental reasons.


